IMPORTS CONTAING ASBESTOS CONTINUE TO HAPPEN

Below is part of a OH&S Bulletin Produced by the CFMEU in Victoria.

This has become a concern as we have in the recent past had Gaskets, Tiles, Motor Vehicles, and now these Wall Panels imported into Australia even though asbestos is banned. These companies are simply stating that the product does not contain asbestos.

Greater scrutiny must be applied on these imports

In early March, six workers fitting out an entertainment venue in Glen Waverley suburban Melbourne spent a week cutting up and installing internal wall panelling, recently imported from China.

The manufacturer's website clearly states that <u>the product is 100% asbestos free</u>, so it was imported in good faith. But concerns were raised that the panels might contain asbestos. Two panels were subsequently sent for testing and the results showed they contained Chrysotile (white asbestos).

Work stopped immediately on the job and the CFMEU issued a nationwide alert over the alarming discovery. WorkSafe Victoria and the Australian Customs Services have been informed, also the Department of Human Services Victoria. "Six families now have reason to be concerned about their future health." "The walls panels are currently being removed and disposed as contaminated waste by a Class A Asbestos Removalist at significant expense to the developer."

For 20 years building workers have been eradicating asbestos from our buildings under strict safety guidelines and specifications. "For years, we've struggled with the shameful effects of exposure to this deadly fibre, but from this incident, it's clear we have to exercise even more diligence to ensure that imported products are genuinely asbestos free.

After some research, <u>it was discovered that the manufacturer is a Canadian and Chinese</u> <u>Joint Venture.</u>

We congratulate the CFMEU for having concerns and getting a couple of sheets tested, BUT the company producing the product stating that it is 100% asbestos free appears to have difficulty in deciding what is fact or deception.

Australia banned the use or import of blue and brown asbestos or asbestos products in the mid-1980s, and banned all manufacture or import of white asbestos products in December 2003. From 31 December 2003, the total ban on manufacture, use, reuse, import, transport, storage or sale of all forms of asbestos came into force.

TURMERIC IN FIGHT AGAINST MESOTHELIOMA

AWORLD-FIRST study by researchers at Flinders Medical Centre has pinpointed the spice turmeric as a vital ingredient in the fight against deadly mesothelioma.

The Flinders' team has used the peppery spice to slow the growth of mesothelioma tumours in human patients' cells. Its active ingredient curcumin has anti-inflammatory properties and research has indicated some anti-carcinogenic properties. Researchers at Flinders have been checking whether this can be used alone or in conjunction with standard therapies to treat malignant mesothelioma, an aggressive cancer caused by the inhalation of asbestos.

Malignant mesothelioma is a tumour of the thin membranes that surround the lungs, heart and abdominal internal organs. Currently there is no effective treatment for the cancer.

Lead researcher associate professor Sonja Klebe, from the Department of Anatomical Pathology at Flinders Medical Centre said average survival after diagnosis of malignant mesothelioma was less than a year, and current therapies to treat the cancer could make patients ill.

"Standard chemotherapy shows only limited success, and radical surgery is only available to few patients, and success is not guaranteed," Professor Klebe said.

"Previous research has been successful in inhibiting the growth of mesothelioma tumour cells in animal model cells in a laboratory setting using curcumin, and recently we have been able to repeat that success — but with the use of patients' cells," she said. "Importantly, this breakthrough allows us to predict if a certain patient is likely to benefit from therapy.

"In addition, we also found that curcumin may affect blood supply to the tumour, and we know that adequate blood supply is essential to maintain tumour growth."

The work was done on fluid drained from patients' chests which is normally discarded as medical waste.

The work indicates curcumin could be taken orally in strong doses or applied directly to an open chest during surgery.


"Curcumin has virtually no side effects, and could be used alone in patients too unwell to tolerate other therapies, or in conjunction with other drugs," Prof Klebe said.

"It may improve treatment response and allow reduction of standard drugs, improving quality of life. It's very exciting research."


