More than 50 building sites across the country are suspected of illegal asbestos contamination from Chinese produced products particularly in building materials. Asbestos Safety and Eradication Agency CEO Peter Tighe says he is aware of some 64 sites where asbestos tainted concrete fibre sheeting has been used in construction.

There have been motor vehicles, car parts, crayons, that have come under the scrutiny of Australian Border Force. The problem we have here is that it is almost impossible to check every product that comes into Australia. ABF said that cargo identified as "high risk" is physically examined. They have a watch list of more than 40 products. The CFMEU have found wall panels they were installing in a building in Victoria. The Chinese company's claim was Asbestos Free but when tested it was found to contain asbestos.

Terry Miller has stated that ABF and Australian Customs just do not have the resources to inspect everything that comes into the country.
EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE President Terry Miller	"What I would like to see is any company who is caught sending asbestos contaminated product into Australia the whole cargo should be returned at their costs. I would also like to see that company and all it's subsidiaries banned from sending any product to Australia for 3 years.

We know it can contains asbestos and that can KILL. So these companies, if they use these products and know it may contain asbestos they should be fined a minimum of One Million Dollars.

There have been some devastating bushfires in Australia this summer, and thanks to the graphic images on television we saw how quickly things can develop.

As the fire shows its fury while destroying homes and sheds etc, any asbestos involved can become friable and then airborne. These fibres can travel enormous distances in wind thus causing possible dangerous situations in other areas.

Remember homes and sheds can have asbestos in many areas such as roof, insulation, fences, floor, coverings, vehicles and so on, we remind you that should you ever be in an unfortunate situation like this or even flooding listen to the emergency services people they will have a good idea where asbestos (if any) is and also any other danger that maybe present.

REMEMBER when you start to clean up your area make sure you use appropriate personal protection. If you need help ask there would be people around to support you your local council for instance. SES people and others.
