Does SOUTH AUSTRALIA have a progressive Council regarding Asbestos?

We start this newsletter with a congratulations to a progressive council in NSW, the Holroyd Council, in the heart of Sydney's western "fibro belt" and with some of the strictest rules on renovating fibro houses, has taken the initiative to alleviate both the financial and environmental pain of removing asbestos. It has picked up two awards in the process. Getting rid of old asbestos building materials is so expensive that many renovators and builders resort to illegal dumping of the highly toxic material.

Apart from the cost of employing specialist demolition trades, the local tip charges hundreds of dollars to take it. Last year the council trialled a free collection of up to 10 square metres of non-friable, or bonded, asbestos waste at residential properties to minimise its disposal in garbage bins and public places – possibly the first such service in Australia.

Demand for the service has been overwhelming, with 8.92 tonnes of asbestos collected from 136 households over nine collection days since last June. Three more collection days will be held by the end of next month and there is a waiting list.

Whilst is a trial it must save many dollars and reduce illegal dumping for both residents and council (sourced from an article in SMH)

<u>David MacFarlane</u>, former managing director of James Hardie Industries

The man credited with deciding in 1978 to eliminate asbestos from James Hardie products said he thought at the time that widespread health concern about its use in building materials was a "media beat-up". David MacFarlane was the managing director of James Hardie Industries between 1978 and 1989 and has never before given evidence about his role in the company, which manufactured and distributed building and other products containing asbestos.

He told the Dust Diseases Tribunal in Sydney on Tuesday that on taking the top job he received a brief from the Hardie board "My job was to get rid of asbestos ... just to do it as quickly as possible," he said. The directive was issued because "asbestos was getting very expensive" and "asbestos was in bad odour around the world".

In extraordinary evidence to the tribunal, Mr MacFarlane said that at the time he thought "the risk side of it was overdone" and "there was a lot of talk about it but I didn't think it was as dangerous as people said, if it was properly controlled".

Under cross-examination by Peter Semmler QC, he said he was so comfortable with the product that "I went on using it myself ... A common thought at the time was that dust inhaled in small degrees over a long period of time didn't do much damage".

"Who held that view?" Mr Semmler asked, to which Mr MacFarlane replied: "The world did."


SCHOOL ROCKS!

VALE RAY COLBERT 21st MAY 2014

Ray Colbert was born in Western Queensland, moving to Brisbane in his childhood. Ray spent more than ten years of his life in the Navy, and it was during this time that he was first exposed to asbestos.

In 2002, Ray was diagnosed with asbestosis, a scarring or fibrosis of the lung tissue that occurs when the body's own immune system fails to expel asbestos fibres. It is a slow onset disease, with shortness of breath on exertion generally being the first noticeable symptom

Committed to protecting others from the terrible effects of asbestos related diseases, Ray joined the Queensland Asbestos Related Disease Support Society (OARDSS) in 2005 and was an active member of the society ever since. His passion and incredible drive for helping others have been an inspiration to all those who have met him.

We at AVA knew and worked closely with Ray and the Queensland Support Group for many years Ray was a true fighter in his endeavors to get the Asbestos awareness message across he is a man who will be sadly missed but genuinely respected.

Noise Induced Hearing Loss

Many industries associated with asbestos in the past were also very noisy industries. We often find that our clients that suffer from asbestos related diseases are also suffering from noise induced hearing loss. If you have worked in noisy conditions you may have a claim for noise induced hearing loss and tinnitus (buzzing or ringing in the ears). Working in industries such as manufacturing, mining, building, construction, transport and infrastructure may give rise to these conditions. However, exposure to excessive noise in *any* workplace may allow you to claim compensation for your hearing impairment.



If you suffer from noise induced hearing loss and/or tinnitus you may have an entitlement to have your medical expenses paid, including the cost of hearing aids. If accepted, WorkCover SA (or the self insured employer) will pay for your hearing aids for the remainder of your lifetime. If your noise induced hearing loss and tinnitus is at least 8.8% you will also have an entitlement to lump sum compensation.

You are entitled to make claim a for compensation for noise induced hearing loss even if you are not working or you have retired.


